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MEMORANDUM OF ASSOCIATION

I. NAME

The society shall be known as the 'Judo Federation of India' and/or the 'Bharatiya Judo Mahasangh' (it is hereinafter referred to as "JFI").

II. REGISTERED OFFICE

The registered office of JFI shall remain in the National Capital Territory of Delhi and at present is at the following address [insert registered address]

III. OBJECTS OF JFI

- A. To promote, develop and popularize the sport of Judo in India for all categories of population.
- B. To be the official and sole governing body in charge of the sport of Judo in India and act as the 'National Sports Federation' recognized by the Government of India for the sport of Judo.
- C. To organize, conduct and/or sponsor national and international Judo competitions and conferences, events, seminars, research etc. relating to Judo.
- D. To select athletes, coaches and/or officials to represent India in international competitions/events and to arrange their training for, and participation in, the same.
- E. To select athletes, coaches and/or officials for national competitions/events and to arrange their training for, and participation in, for the same.
- F. To control and improve the quality and standards of the sport of Judo in India and to this end, lay down policies, roadmaps, guidelines and make rules and regulations in all matters relating to the sport of Judo, recognizing that the primary stakeholders are the players and fans in India, and that accountability, transparency, purity and integrity of the sport are the core values.
- G. To protect and promote the welfare and interest of Judo athletes and coaches and provide suitable framework and support for development of their skills, and for that purpose, organize training programmes, establish training academies, provide sponsorship, remuneration and/or other monetary assistance to Judo athletes and coaches, and hold tournaments/competitions, exhibition matches and any other matches and take all other required steps.
- H. To award grades, including "dan" ranks, in accordance with rules of the International Judo Federation.
- I. To facilitate the advancement of coaching education and technical officiating in India.
- J. To provide for measures necessary for elimination of unethical and unfair practices in the sport of Judo, including competition manipulation.

- K. To strive for sportsmanship and professionalism in the sport of Judo and its governance and administration; to inculcate principles of transparency and ethical standards in players, team officials, referees, judges and administrators; and to ban doping, age fraud, sexual harassment and all other forms of inequity and discrimination.
- L. To foster the spirit of sportsmanship and the ideals of Judo amongst school, college and university students and others and to educate them regarding the same.
- M. To take disciplinary action against any member, Judoka, coach or anyone associated with the sport for any type of cheating, misbehavior or undesirable activity bringing discredit to the sport.
- N. To encourage democratization of, and transparency in, the governance and administration of the sport of Judo, and, to this end, encourage the formation of State, regional or other Judo associations/federations and lay down norms for their recognition and affiliation which achieve uniformity and transparency in the structure, functioning and processes of the member associations/federations.
- O. To assist Judo associations/federations across the country.
- P. To liaise with and represent India at various international fora and organizations involved in the sport of Judo. To collaborate and undertake exchange programmes in relation to Judokas and technical officers with other countries.
- Q. To affiliate with the International Judo Federation, Indian Olympic Association and other national associations/federations.
- R. To employ and appoint various officers, employees and/or personnel for the purposes of running and administration of JFI; to remunerate them for their services in accordance with applicable law; and to remove/terminate, dismiss, suspend and/or take other appropriate disciplinary action against such officers, employees or personnel.
- S. To raise finance for the fulfilment of the aims and objects of JFI.
- T. To receive and collect subscriptions, donations, gifts, trophies, grants and assistance either in cash or kind, or borrow money, and expend the same for the fulfilment of all or any of the aims and objects of JFI.
- U. To acquire or purchase properties - movable and immovable, and assets - tangible and intangible; and to sell, manage, mortgage, lease, exchange, dispose of, transfer or otherwise deal with all or any property/assets of JFI.
- V. To apply the capital and income from the properties and assets of JFI, and the proceeds of the sale or transfer thereof, towards the objects of JFI.
- W. To provide a fair and transparent grievance redressal mechanism to players, support personnel and other individuals/entities associated with Judo.

- X. To make donations or give grants, either in cash or kind, for:
 - (1) Causes conducive to the promotion of the sport of Judo.
 - (2) The benefit of Judo athletes and coaches.
 - (3) Awarding sponsorships/scholarships in the field of Judo.
- Y. To make and modify rules and regulations and bye-laws to carry out the aims and objects of JFI and for the purposes of governance and administration of JFI.
- Z. To carry out its activities and implement its objectives in an independent and autonomous manner, free from any government, political, religious or other influence.
- AA. To promote the Olympic spirit.
- BB. Generally, to do all such other acts and things as may be convenient and/or conducive to the carrying out of the objects of JFI.

IV. INCOME AND PROPERTIES

- A. All the income, earning, moveable, immovable properties of JFI shall be solely utilized and applied towards the promotion of its objects only set forth in the Memorandum of Association and no profit thereof shall be paid or transferred directly or indirectly by way of dividends, bonus, profits or in any manner whatsoever to the present and past member of the society or to any person claiming through any or more of the present or past member.
- B. No member of society shall have any personal claim on any moveable or immovable properties of the society or make any profit, whatsoever by virtue of his/her/its membership.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

PART I: PRELIMINARY

1. SCOPE AND APPLICATION

- 1.1. These Rules and Regulations shall govern the functioning, governance and administration of JFI and the relationship between JFI and its Members.
- 1.2. These Rules and Regulations shall come into effect on the date when these Rules and Regulations received approval of the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi in W.P. (Civil) 3088/2022, *Haryana State Judo Association v Judo Federation of India & Ors.* or on such other date as may be appointed by the Court. The date on which these Rules and Regulations come into effect is hereinafter referred to as the "**Effective Date**".
- 1.3. These Rules and Regulations shall supersede and substitute all prior constitutions, rules, regulations and bye-laws governing JFI.
- 1.4. However, these Rules and Regulations shall have prospective effect, i.e., they shall not affect anything done or suffered, or any right, privilege, obligation, penalty, punishment or liability acquired, accrued or incurred, or any investigation, legal proceeding or remedy in respect of the foregoing prior to the coming into effect of these Rules and Regulations and such matters will continue to be governed by the constitution, rules, regulations and bye-laws of JFI as applicable prior to the coming into effect of these Rules and Regulations.

2. DEFINITIONS AND INTERPRETATION

- 2.1. In these Rules and Regulations, unless otherwise expressed or the context otherwise requires, the following terms shall have the meaning as given below:
 - a) "**AC Member**" shall have the meaning given to it in Rule 17.1.
 - b) "**Adjourned General Meeting**" shall have the meaning given to it in Rule 13.7(a).
 - c) "**Admission Fee**" shall have the meaning given to it in Rule 9.1.
 - d) "**Annual Fee**" shall have the meaning given to it in Rule 9.1.
 - e) "**Annual General Meeting**" shall have the meaning given to it in Rule 13.3(a).
 - f) "**Associate Member**" shall mean a Sports Board which has obtained Associate Membership in accordance with these Rules and Regulations.
 - g) "**Associate Membership**" refers to the category of membership of JFI having the attributes set out in Rule 5.3.
 - h) "**Athletes' Body**" shall mean the Body of JFI whose composition, powers, functions, duties and manner of functioning is set out in Rule 16.

- i) **“Athletes’ Commission”** shall mean the Body of JFI whose composition, powers, functions, duties and manner of functioning is set out in Rule 17
- j) **“Athletes’ Disciplinary Committee”** shall mean the Body of JFI whose composition, powers, functions, duties and manner of functioning is set out in Rule 33.
- k) **“Athlete Member”** shall mean a Judoka who has obtained Athlete Membership in accordance with these Rules and Regulations.
- l) **“Athlete Membership”** refers to the category of membership of JFI having the attributes set out in Rule 5.4.
- m) **“Auditor”** shall mean the auditor of the accounts of JFI appointed by the General Body to discharge the functions set out in Rule 25.
- n) **“Authorised Representative”** shall have the meaning given to it in Rule 13.1(c).
- o) **“Body of JFI”** shall have the meaning given to it in Rule 12.1.
- p) **“Bye-laws”** shall have the meaning given to it in Rule 38.1.
- q) **“Chairperson”** shall mean the chairperson of the General Meeting or the EC Meeting (as the case maybe), who will be responsible for conducting the meeting.
- r) **“Code of Ethics”** shall mean the standards of ethical conduct for Judo Athletes/Officials, persons associated with the sport of Judo and persons associated with JFI in any capacity whatsoever, as Prescribed. [Inter alia, the Code of Ethics shall provide measures for protection of vulnerable persons against abuse by person in a position of trust, responsibility of authority.](#)
- s) **“Conflict of Interest”** shall have the meaning given to it in Rule 29.1.
- t) **“Disqualification Event”** shall, with respect to a person, mean any of the following:
 - i. [Being below 18 \(eighteen\) years of age.](#)
 - ii. [Not being a citizen of India or ceasing to be a citizen of India.](#)
 - iii. [Attainment of the age of 70 \(seventy\) years.](#)
 - iv. [Conviction by a court of competent jurisdiction anywhere in the world for a for a criminal offence having imprisonment as punishment. Provided that the disqualification on this account shall operate for a period of 4 \(four\) years after the completion of such sentence.](#)
 - v. [Being declared of unsound mind under applicable law.](#)

~~iv.vi.~~ Being declared or insolvent under applicable law. Provided that this disqualification shall operate for the period of insolvency.

~~v.vii.~~ Being or becoming a Minister of the Union of India or any State Government, Member of Parliament, Member of State Legislative Council, Member of State Legislative Assembly, government servant or holding any public office.

Provided that this disqualification shall not apply to those government servants who are recruited to the service under a sports quota.

For the purpose of this sub-clause, 'public office' shall include the offices referred to in the Parliament (Prevention of Disqualification) Act, 1959, Section 3.

~~vi.viii.~~ Being found guilty of Misconduct. Provided this disqualification shall operate for a period of 4 (four) years.

~~vii.ix.~~ Being subject to any disciplinary action or penalty, including suspension or ban, by any sports authority in the world, including JFI. Provided that this disqualification shall operate for the duration of such suspension/ ban.

~~viii.x.~~ Removal from team, post, competition etc by the Athletes' Disciplinary Committee and/or the Ombudsman. Provided this disqualification shall operate for a period of 4 (four) years.

- u) **"District Association"** shall mean an association/federation/society working for the promotion, development and popularisation of the sport of Judo in a district within a State or Union Territory.
- v) **"EC Meeting"** shall have the meaning given to it in Rule 14.6.
- w) **"EC Member(s)"** shall have the meaning given to it in Rule 14.2, and it is clarified that the term includes Office Bearers.
- x) **"Effective Date"** shall have the meaning given to it in Rule 1.2.
- y) **"Electoral Officer"** shall have the meaning given to it in Rule 23.1.
- z) **"Ethics Committee"** shall mean the Body of JFI whose composition, powers, functions, duties and manner of functioning is set out in Rule 37.
- ~~z)aa)~~ **"Executive Committee"** shall mean the Body of JFI whose composition, powers, functions, duties and manner of functioning is set out in Rule 14.
- ~~aa)bb)~~ **"Extra-ordinary General Meeting"** shall have the meaning given to it in Rule 13.4(a).

- ~~bb)cc)~~ **"Financial Year"** shall mean the year beginning on 1 April and ending on 31 March.
- ~~ee)dd)~~ **"Full Member"** shall mean a State/UT Associations which has obtained Full Membership in accordance with these Rules and Regulations.
- ~~ee)ee)~~ **"Full Membership"** refers to the category of membership of JFI having the attributes set out in Rule 5.2.
- ~~ee)ff)~~ **"General Body"** shall mean the Body of JFI whose composition, powers, functions, duties and manner of functioning is set out in Rule 13.
- ~~ff)gg)~~ **"General Meeting"** shall mean either an Annual General Meeting or an Extraordinary General meeting of the General Body.
- ~~gg)~~ **"General Secretary"** shall mean the person who discharges the powers, functions and duties as set out in Rule 15.2.
- hh) **"Immediate Relative"** of a person shall mean his/her parent, spouse, grandchild, parent of spouse, sibling, spouse of a sibling, sibling of spouse, son, daughter, son-in-law, daughter-in-law, sibling of parent, spouse of sibling of parent, son of sibling of parent, daughter of sibling of parent, grandchild of sibling of parent.
- ii) **"Internal Complaints Committee"** shall mean the Body of JFI whose composition, powers, functions, duties and manner of functioning is set out in Rule 34.
- jj) **"JFI"** shall mean the Judo Federation of India.
- ~~kk)~~ **"Joint Secretary"** shall mean the person who discharges the powers, functions and duties as set out in Rule 15.5.
- ~~kk)~~ **"Judo Athlete/Official"** shall mean current or former/retired Judoka, team officials, staff of team, referees, judges, commentators and other members of the contingent in relation to the practice of the sport, such as during competitions and training sessions.
- ll) **"Judoka"** shall mean any person who (a) is practising or has practised Judo; and/or (b) is coaching or has coached Judo practitioners.
- mm) **"Judoka of Outstanding Merit"** shall mean a Judoka who is included in JFI's [roster of Judokas of outstanding merit prepared and published in accordance with the procedure prescribed under the National Sports Act.](#)
- nn) **"Member"** shall mean a Full Member, an Associate Member or an Athlete Member, and the term **"Membership"** shall be construed accordingly.
- oo) **"Memorandum"** shall mean the Memorandum of Association of JFI.

- pp) **"Misconduct"**, in relation to a natural person, shall include:
- i. breach of Code of Ethics [and the Sports Safety Code](#).
 - ii. working contrary to the Objects of JFI.
 - iii. breach of these Rules and Regulations, the Bye-laws, policies, rules/procedures of JFI/Bodies of JFI, applicable law, and other documents and/or stipulations which apply to and govern JFI.
 - iv. causing prejudice to the interest of JFI and/or the sport of Judo.
 - v. failure to discharge his/her functions and duties and/or dereliction of duties.
 - vi. breach of trust; fraud
 - vii. misappropriation of funds.
 - viii. improper and malafide exercise of power.
 - ix. not declaring Conflict of Interest.
 - x. existence of intractable Conflict of Interest; where the Conflict of Interest is tractable, failure to resolve the same.
 - xi. sexual harassment.
 - xii. damage to property; injury to any person.
 - xiii. un-sports ~~person~~ ~~man~~ like behaviour, which includes insulting, making undesirable gestures, abusing the decision of the judges/referees, provoking the opponents or spectator or committing any act not in keeping with the propriety of sports.
 - xiv. doping, age fraud, and competition manipulation.
 - xv. such other conduct as may be Prescribed.

qq) ["National Sports Act" shall mean the National Sports Governance Act, 2025, as amended from time to time, and any rules or regulations framed thereunder.](#)

~~rr)~~rr) **"National Sports Code"** shall mean the National Sports Development Code of India 2011, as amended from time to time, and any further codes which may come to substitute/supplement the National Sports Development Code of India 2011.

~~ss)~~ss) **"NCT of Delhi"** shall mean National Capital Territory of Delhi.

~~tt)~~tt) **"Objects of JFI"** shall mean the objects of JFI as set out in the Memorandum.

aaa) "Safe Sports Policy" shall mean the policy for ensuring safety of Judo Athletes/Officials, and persons associated with JFI in any capacity whatsoever, in relation to all activities, events, operations and proceedings of JFI, as Prescribed. Inter alia, it shall provide for protection and safety of women and minor athletes.

bbb) "Secretary General" shall mean the person who discharges the powers, functions and duties as set out in Rule 15.2.

~~zz)ccc)~~ **"Selection Committee"** shall mean the Body of JFI whose composition, powers, functions, duties and manner of functioning is set out in Rule 18.

~~aaa)ddd)~~ **"Sports Board"** shall mean an association/federation/society, other than a State/UT Association, or a department of any government or government organisation or agency (a) working for the promotion, development and popularisation of the sports; and (b) which is created under the aegis of and/or by members of a service(s)/department(s) under the Government of India and/or any State(s) or Union Territory(ies).

~~eee)fff)~~ **"State/UT Association"** shall mean the JFI recognised solean association/federation/society working for the promotion, development and popularisation of sports in a given State or Union Territory.

~~eee)hhh)~~ **"Union Territory"** shall mean a union territory in the Union of India and shall include National Capital Territory of Delhi.

~~fff) "Vice-President" shall mean the person who discharges the powers, functions and duties as per Rule 15.4.~~

2.2. In these Rules and Regulations (unless the context requires otherwise):

- a) the headings are inserted for convenience only and shall not affect the construction of these Rules and Regulations;
- b) words using the singular or plural number shall also include the plural or singular number, respectively;
- c) words of either gender shall include the other gender;
- d) the terms "hereof", "herein", "hereby", "hereto", "hereunder" and derivative or similar words refer to these entire Rules and Regulations;
- e) any reference herein to any Rule is to such Rule in these Rules and Regulations;
- f) reference to any law shall include references to any such law as it may, from time to time, be amended, supplemented or re-enacted, and any reference to statutory provision shall include any subordinate legislation made from time to time under that provision;
- g) references to the words "include" and "including" shall be construed without limitation;
- h) reference to days, months and years are to calendar days, calendar months and calendar years, respectively, unless defined otherwise or inconsistent with the context or meaning thereof; and
- i) reference to any 'communication' or 'notice' is to communication / notice in writing.

3. JURISDICTION

- 3.1. JFI shall have jurisdiction over the entire territory of India.

4. HEADQUARTERS

- 4.1. The headquarters of JFI shall be located in the NCT of Delhi.

PART II: MEMBERSHIP

5. CATEGORIES OF MEMBERSHIP

- 5.1. There shall be only 3 (three) categories of membership of JFI: (a) Full Membership; (b) Associate Membership; and (c) Athlete Membership.

5.2. Full Membership

- a) This shall be open to only State/UT Associations which meet the eligibility criteria set out in Rule 6.
- b) It shall be unlimited in tenure unless terminated in accordance with these Rules and Regulations.

c) It shall carry the right to participate in and vote at the meetings of the General Body. ~~Each~~A Full Member shall have ~~12~~ (twoone) votes at the meetings of the General Body.

~~e)d~~ JFI shall always have as Full Members at least 2/3rd (two thirds) of State/UT Associations.

5.3. Associate Membership

- a) This shall be open to only Sports Boards which meet the eligibility criteria set out in Rule 6.
- b) It shall be unlimited in tenure unless terminated in accordance with these Rules and Regulations.
- c) It shall carry the right to participate in the meetings of the General Body but not vote therein.
- d) A State/UT Association which is no longer a Full Member shall also be eligible to become an Associate Member on conditions as may be Prescribed.

5.4. Athlete Membership

- a) This shall be open only to Judokas selected by the Athletes' Body and 4 (four) Judokas of Outstanding Merit elected by the Athletes' Body.
- b) It shall be for a period of 4 (four) years unless terminated earlier in accordance with these Rules and Regulations.
- c) It shall carry the right to participate in and vote at the meetings of the General Body. Each Athlete Member shall have ~~12~~ (twoone) votes at the meetings of the General Body.

6. **ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR MEMBERSHIP**

6.1. A State/UT Association, a Sports Board or a Judoka (as the case maybe) shall be granted Membership only if they comply with the eligibility criteria set out in this Rule.

6.2. Full Membership

To obtain Full Membership, a State/UT Association should:

- a) have a legal status as a not-for-profit company incorporated under Section 8 of Companies Act 2013, a society registered under the Societies Registration Act 1860 or the societies act of a state, or a public charitable trust.
- b) be an autonomous body, free from any government, political, religious or other influence.
- c) be working exclusively for the promotion, development and popularisation of the sport of Judo in the State or Union Territory where it functions.

- d) should have more than 50% (fifty percent) of the District Associations in its State/ Union Territory, which are working exclusively for the promotion, development and popularisation of the sport of Judo, affiliated as its members. The eligibility criteria for the District Associations which can be affiliated may be as Prescribed.
- e) have a governing/constitutional document which:
- i. complies with the National Sports Act, government directives and applicable law;
 - ii. provides that the State/UT Association shall comply with the Rules and Regulations, Bye-laws, policies, rules/procedures and decisions of JFI/Bodies of JFI; ~~and~~
 - iii. at the minimum, is in line and not in contradiction with the provisions of the National Sports Code and the Memorandum, Rules and Regulations, Bye-laws, polices, rules/procedures of JFI; ~~and-~~
 - iv. provides that members of all its bodies, including executive bodies and office-bearers, are residents of / domiciled in the State / Union Territory where it has jurisdiction.

6.3. Associate Membership

To obtain Associate Membership, a Sports Board should:

- a) be an autonomous body, free from any government, political, religious or other influence.
- b) be working for the promotion, development and popularisation of the sport of Judo, among other sports, if any.
- c) have an all India standing.
- d) have a governing/constitutional document which:
 - i. complies with the National Sports Act, National Sports Code, government directives and applicable law;
 - ii. provides that the Sports Board shall comply with the Rules and Regulation, Bye-laws, policies, rules/procedures and decisions of JFI/Bodies of JFI; and
 - iii. adopts the principles of governance and administration enshrined in these Rules and Regulations and provides, *inter alia*, for broad-based representation in membership, governance and management of the Sports Board, including that of athletes; periodic elections for office-bearers and members of executive bodies; tenure and term limits and cooling-off provisions for office bearers and members of bodies;

transparency in functioning of bodies and maintenance of records; provisions to deal with conflict-of-interest; proper maintenance and audit of accounts; and grievance redressal mechanism for members, athletes, coaches and other persons associated with the sport of Judo.

6.4. Athlete Membership

a) To obtain Athlete Membership, a Judoka / Judoka of Outstanding Merit:

a) i. must be member of the Athletes' Body (except in the case of election in the category of 'Judoka of Outstanding Merit');

b) ii. must be selected by the Athletes' Body by way on an election;

c) iii. must not be an AC Member or EC Member; and

iv. must not be subject to a Disqualification Event.

6.5. Where a State/UT Association or a Sports Board, which is already a Member of JFI, does not meet the foregoing eligibility criteria as on the Effective Date, it shall have a period of 180 (one-hundred eighty) days, or such further period as may be granted by the General Body, for fulfilling the eligibility criteria.

7. **NUMBER OF MEMBERS**

7.1. The maximum number of Full Members shall be total number of States and Union Territories in India. There shall be only 1 (one) Full Member from each State and Union Territory.

7.2. There is no limit on the number of Associate Members.

7.3. The number of Athlete Members shall be 25 (twenty-five) % (rounded up to the next number) of the total maximum number of Full Members and Athlete Members. 50 (fifty) % (rounded up to the next number) of Athlete Members shall be women.

8. **PROCEDURE FOR GRANT OF MEMBERSHIP**

8.1. For Full Members and Associate Members

a) The eligible State/UT Association / Sports Board shall submit an application to the Executive Committee containing such particulars and documents as may be Prescribed.

b) After satisfying itself that the application is complete in all regards and that the applicant meets the eligibility criteria set out in Rule 6, the Executive Committee shall place the application with its comments thereon before the General Body in the next General Meeting for the General Body's approval.

- c) In case of deficiencies in the application or the eligibility of the applicant, the Executive Committee shall return the application to the concerned State/UT Association or Sports Board and such State/UT Association or Sports Board shall be eligible to reapply for membership after curing such deficiencies.
- d) On approval of the General Body, the concerned State/UT Association or Sports Board shall be admitted as a Full Member or an Associate Member (as the case maybe).

8.2. For Athlete Members

- a) The Athletes' Commission/ Executive Commission (as the case may be) shall send the names of the Judokas selected by the Athletes' Body by way of an election to the Executive Committee.
- b) The Executive Committee shall include the names of the selected Judokas in the list of Members and circulate their names to the other Members.

9. MEMBERSHIP FEE

- 9.1. Each Full Member and Associate Member shall be required to pay a fee for admission to Membership "**Admission Fee**" (if they are not Members as on the Effective Date) and an annual Membership fee "**Annual Fee**". The Athlete Member shall not be required to pay either Admission Fee or Annual Fee.
- 9.2. The Admission Fee and Annual Fee shall be as Prescribed.
- 9.3. The Admission Fee shall be paid immediately on grant of approval of Membership. The Annual Fee shall be paid before the end of the Financial Year, i.e., on or before March 31 of each year.
- 9.4. The Annual Fee for a new Full Member / Associate Member shall be pro-rated according to the months remaining in the Financial Year from the date of obtainment of Membership.

10. OBLIGATIONS OF MEMBERS

- 10.1. In addition to the obligations of Members as set out in these Rules and Regulations and Bye-laws, the Members shall fulfil the obligations as set out in this Rule.

10.2. General Obligations

- a) To comply with the Rules and Regulations, Bye-laws, policies and rules/ procedure and directives of JFI.
- b) To not work against the Objects of JFI and/or cause harm to the sport of Judo.
- c) To not undermine the authority of JFI as the National Sports Federation and the sole governing body for the sport of Judo in India.

d) To not interfere in the affairs of other Members.

- e) [To comply with Statute, regulations and decisions of International Judo Federation and the Olympic Charter, and exercise the rights, perform the duties and discharge the functions as specified therein.](#)
- f) [To comply with the National Sports Act, National Sports Code, government directives and applicable law.](#)
- ~~e)g)~~ [To attend the meetings of the General Body.](#)

10.3. Full Members and Associate Members

- a) To submit their respective governing documents/constitutional documents, a list of their respective members, list of their office-bearers and members of their executive bodies, a copy of annual report, annual balance-sheet and audited statement of accounts, a report of their activities, calendar of sports for the year, and such other information/document as may be Prescribed within 3 (three) months of the closing of the Financial Year and as and when there is any change in the aforementioned information/documents.
- b) To register all Judokas (i.e., players and coaches) and Judo referees in their respective State / Union Territory / organisation. To prepare and maintain a database of such Judokas and referees. To furnish such database to JFI on a quarterly basis.
- c) To conduct elections in their bodies, including the executive bodies and athletes commission, where members of such bodies are required to be appointed by election as per their governing document, in accordance with the governing document. [The Full Member/Associate Member shall appoint an electoral officer from the roster maintained by JFI to oversee its election process and ensure free and fair elections.](#)
- d) To comply with and implement anti-doping guidelines and measures.
- e) To comply with applicable law. To ensure all statutory and legal compliances.
- f) To ensure that there are no factional disputes within the Members and there is no mismanagement within the Members.
- g) To arrange for participation of teams in at least 2 (two) age categories in the National Judo Championship.
- h) To permit observers from JFI for elections in their bodies and meetings of their general body.
- i) To honour its commitment or any other obligation to JFI and other Members.

10.4. Full Members

- a) To conduct the State Judo Championship every year for each age group and the National Judo Championship/other events as and when allotted.

- b) To participate in all JFI national events and other activities.

11. REMOVAL, SUSPENSION AND TERMINATION OF MEMBERSHIP

11.1. A Member shall be liable to be suspended and/or removed from Membership in case of the following events ("**Event(s) of Default**"):

- a) the Member's order, decision, conduct or any other action / omission is:
- i. in violation of these Rules and Regulations, the Bye-laws, the policies of JFI/Bodies of JFI, the rules and procedure of JFI/Bodies of JFI, applicable law, and other documents and or stipulations which apply to and govern JFI;
 - ii. prejudicial to the interest of JFI and/or the sport of Judo; and/or
 - iii. contrary to the Objects of JFI.
- b) the Member has obtained Membership by fraud, misrepresentation and/or concealment.
- c) the Member ceases to meet the eligibility criteria for Membership.

11.2. Where an Event of Default is alleged to have occurred, the Executive Committee shall investigate the Event of Default and submit its report containing its findings and recommended action to the General Body for consideration and decision within 3 (three) months from the date the alleged Event of Default is brought to its notice.

Provided that, with respect to an Event of Default no investigation by the Executive Committee shall be necessary if a finding on the Event of Default has already been rendered by the Ombudsman pursuant to Rule 35. If the Ombudsman has found that the Event of Default has not occurred, then the proceedings under this Clause shall terminate. If the Ombudsman has found that the Event of Default has occurred, then the decision of the Ombudsman along with Executive Committee's report on recommended action qua the defaulting Member shall be submitted to the General Body for consideration and decision. The Ombudsman shall give its findings within 3 (three) months from the date it receives a complaint regarding the alleged Event of Default.

11.3. The General Body may take such action as it deems fit, including directing the Executive Committee to further investigate the matter (except where the Ombudsman has already given a finding), granting the defaulting Member time to cure the Event of Default, suspending the Member's Membership and removing the Member from Membership. The decision of the General Body shall be taken at a General Meeting (where the defaulting Member shall not have a right to vote) and shall be final and binding on all concerned parties. Removal of a Member from JFI shall require a resolution by 2/3rd (two-thirds) majority of the total votes of the

Members (excluding the Member whose removal is being considered) present at a General Meeting.

- 11.4. Where a Full Member is removed from Membership, JFI shall have the power to appoint an ad-hoc committee to assume control over the affairs of the Full Member and re-establishing governance and curing the cause of removal, within a specified timeframe.
- 11.5. A State/UT Association or a Sports Board, which has been removed from Membership, shall be eligible to apply for and re-obtain Membership after 1 (one) year of removal, subject to removing the cause of removal of Membership and subject to conditions laid down by the General Body for re-joining the Membership.
- 11.6. A Judoka who has been removed as an Athlete Member, shall not be eligible to reobtain Membership of JFI.
- 11.7. A Member's Membership shall terminate:
 - a) In case of removal.
 - b) In case of a Full Member and Associate Member, upon their resignation, dissolution or declaration of insolvency.
 - c) With respect to an Athlete Member, upon death or resignation.
- 11.8. Where the Membership of an Athlete Member terminates, the Athletes' Body shall elect a new Athlete Member.

PART III: GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

12. BODIES OF JFI

- 12.1. The management, administration and governance of JFI shall be undertaken by and/or include the following bodies ("**Body of JFI**"):
 - a) the General Body,
 - b) the Executive Committee, and such other sub-committees that may be constituted by the Executive Committee from time to time,
 - c) the Athletes' Body,
 - d) the Athletes' Commission,
 - e) the Selection Committee,
 - f) the Technical Council
 - g) the Athletes' Disciplinary Committee,
 - h) the Internal Complaints Committee,
 - i) [the Ethics Committee.](#)

~~h~~j) the Ombudsman, and

~~j~~k) such other committees that may be constituted by the General Body from time to time.

13. THE GENERAL BODY

13.1. Composition

- a) The General Body shall be composed of all the Members.
- b) The Athlete Members shall represent themselves. They shall not be represented through any other person, including proxies.
- c) The Full Members and Associate Members shall be represented at the General Body through 1 (one) authorised representative eachs (“**Authorised Representative**”), ~~with each Full Member being represented by 2 (two) Authorised Representatives (one male and one female, where an eligible person is available) and each Associate Member being represented by one Authorised Representative.~~
 - i. The Authorised Representative shall be a member of the executive body of the concerned Full Member / Associate Member.
 - ii. The Authorised Representative cannot be a person who is subject to any Disqualification Event.
 - iii. One person shall act as the Authorised Representative for only one Member.
 - iv. An Athlete Member cannot act as the Authorised Representative for any member.
 - v. An Authorised Representative cannot authorise any other person, including proxies, to appear on his/her behalf.
 - vi. The Full Members and Associate Members shall communicate the names of their respective Authorised Representatives prior to the General Meeting.
 - vii. The nomination of the Authorised Representative shall be supported by a resolution of the executive body of the concerned Full Member/Associate Member.
 - viii. The Authorised Representative shall act solely in accordance with the instructions of the Member her/she is representing.

13.2. Functions, powers and duties

The functions, powers and duties of the General Body shall be as follows:

- a) To be the supreme Body of JFI, having overall control and responsibility of the functioning of JFI and Bodies of JFI and having all powers of governance, management and decision making.
- b) To carry into effect the objects of JFI.
- c) To formulate and enforce the policies of JFI.
- d) To hold, control and administer the funds and other properties of JFI.
- e) To provide funding to its Members.
- f) To explain and interpret these Rules and Regulations and to take a decision on any issue which is not covered under these Rules and Regulations.
- g) To call for, and review, any record, including accounts and financial statements, of JFI and its Members.
- h) To consider, review, ratify, modify and/or set aside any decision or order of any other Body of JFI, excluding the Athletes' Disciplinary Committee and the Ombudsman.
- i) To constitute/dissolve committees or sub-committees (other than those provided under Rules 10.1(a) to (h)), as and when necessary.
- j) To decide on all proposals submitted for consideration by the Members and the Executive Committee.
- k) To admit, suspend and remove Members to/from Membership.
- l) To delegate such powers to the other Bodies of JFI as it deems fit.
- m) To discharge the functions, exercise the powers and perform the duties as provided in these Rules and Regulations.
- n) To frame and adopt the Code of Ethics, [Safe Sports Policy](#) and rules for prevention of, protection against, and punishment for, doping, sexual harassment, age fraud and competition manipulation.
- o) To exercise such other powers and to perform such other duties as are necessary for carrying out the Objects of JFI.

13.3. Annual General Meeting

- a) The General Body shall meet at least once in every Financial Year, before 30th June. Such meeting is referred to as the "**Annual General Meeting**".
- b) The Annual General Meeting shall be called by the Executive Committee and take place at such date, time and place as may be decided by the Executive Committee.
- c) The following business shall be transacted at every Annual General Meeting:

- i. Confirmation of the minutes of the previous Annual General Meeting and of the Extra-ordinary General Meeting, if any.
- ii. Consideration and adoption of the President's Report on the working of JFI.
- iii. Consideration and adoption of the audited accounts for the year under review.
- iv. Consideration and adoption of the annual budget.
- v. Consideration and adoption of the long term development plan for the sport of Judo.
- vi. Appointment and removal of Auditors and fixing their remuneration.
- vii. Appointment and removal of the members of the Ombudsman.
- viii. Election of the Executive Committee (if due).
- ix. Consideration of the annual calendar of competition and events.
- x. Consideration of the reports and recommendations of the Executive Committee and other Bodies of JFI and to propose policy directions for JFI.
- xi. Approval of the decisions of the Executive Committee.
- xii. Consideration of any motion moved by a Member, notice whereof is given in advance.
- xiii. Consideration of any other business which may be included in the agenda for the meeting.
- xiv. Transaction of any other business of informal character as may be permitted by the Chairperson.

13.4. Extra-ordinary General Meeting

- a) All meetings of the General Body other than the Annual General Meeting are referred to as "**Extra-ordinary General Meetings**".
- b) An Extra-ordinary General Meeting shall be called by the Executive Committee:
 - i. on a resolution of the Executive Committee, specifically stating the business to be transacted at such meeting;
 - ii. on a resolution of the General Body, specifically stating the business to be transacted at such meeting.; or

- iii. on a requisition signed by Members having at least $1/3^{\text{rd}}$ (one-third) of the total votes in a General Meeting, specifically stating the business to be transacted at such meeting.
- c) Such meeting shall be called for within 30 (thirty) days of passing of the resolution or receipt of requisition, as the case may be, giving notice in accordance with Rule 13.6. The date, time and place of the meeting shall be as decided by the Executive Committee.

13.5. Power of Members to convene a General Meeting

- a) If the Executive Committee fails to call for an Annual General Meeting within the time period stipulated in Rule 13.3(a) or an Extra-ordinary General Meeting within the time period stipulated in Rule 13.4(c), then Members having at least $1/3^{\text{rd}}$ (one-third) of the total votes in a General Meeting may call for and convene such a meeting by giving notice in accordance with Rule 13.6.
- b) In such a case, the General Meeting shall be held only at the Headquarters of JFI or if the same is not available, then at another location in NCT of Delhi.

13.6. Notice and Agenda of General Meeting

- a) For a General Meeting, 45 (forty-five) days' notice shall be given to all Members.
- b) The notice shall be accompanied by the resolution of the Executive Committee, resolution of the General Body or the requisition of the Members, as the case may be, calling for the meeting, and an agenda setting out the business to be transacted at the meeting along with explanatory notes and documents relevant for discussing the business to be transacted.
- c) Any Member may seek addition of an agenda item up to 30 (thirty) days before the date of the General Meeting by sending the same to the Executive Committee.
- d) After receiving the additional agenda items proposed by Members, the Executive Committee shall circulate a revised agenda to all Members, not later than 20 (twenty) days before the date of the General Meeting.
- e) A General Meeting may be called at a shorter notice if consented to by Members having at least $3/4$ (three-fourth) of the total votes in a General Meeting or if so deemed fit by the Executive Committee. In such a case, business items other than those specified in the agenda with the notice, shall not be raised at the meeting.

e)f) Notice of all General Meetings shall also be given to the Government of India in accordance with Rule 13.6. The Government of India shall be entitled to send its observer to such a meeting.

13.7. Quorum, Chairperson, Voting at the General Meeting

- a) Except as otherwise provided in these Rules and Regulations:
 - i. the quorum for a General Meeting shall be Members having at least 1/3rd (one-third) of the total votes in a General Meeting, with the Full Members constituting the voting majority. No business shall be transacted at the General Meeting unless the quorum requisite is present at the commencement of the business of the meeting. If the requisite quorum is not present, then the meeting held shall be invalid and all resolutions passed, or discussions made therein shall be without any force.
 - ii. If, within an hour from the time appointed for the General Meeting a quorum is not present, the meeting shall stand adjourned by 10 (ten) days at the same place and time ("**Adjourned General Meeting**"). A notice of the Adjourned General Meeting shall be circulated to all Members. If, at the Adjourned General Meeting, the quorum is not present within an hour from the time of the meeting, the Members present shall form the quorum provided that notice for the Adjourned General Meeting has been duly served on all Members of JFI. No decision shall be taken at such Adjourned General Meeting in respect of any matter which was not part of the original agenda for such meeting.
- b) A General Meeting may be held through video-conferencing. Members shall be permitted to join a General Meeting through video-conferencing.
- c) The President shall preside over the General Meeting as the Chairperson and in his/her absence, the ~~General Secretary~~Secretary General. In the absence of both the President and the ~~General Secretary~~Secretary General, the Members / Authorised Representatives present shall select a Chairperson from amongst themselves. The Chairperson shall not have any casting vote.
- d) At the General Meeting, every Full Member and Athlete Member shall have ~~12~~ (two) votes each. Voting shall be by show of hands or by a ballot. In either case, the Chairperson shall record how a Member / Authorised Representative has voted. Unless otherwise provided, decisions at the General Meetings shall be taken by simple majority of votes present. Voting by proxy is not allowed.
- e) In case of a tie in votes, the concerned business item(s) shall be put to vote again after one hour, and if the need arises, the General Meeting shall stand adjourned by one hour to enable the second vote. If there is a tie in votes

even in the second vote, then the business item shall be stood over for consideration at the next General Meeting.

13.8. Presence of EC Members at the General Meeting

- a) All EC Members shall be present at the General Meeting.
- b) They shall be required to answer all such queries raised by Members which have been sent by the Members to the Executive Committee at least 10 (ten) days prior to the date of the General Meeting.

13.9. Minutes of the General Meeting

- a) The minutes recording the proceedings of the General Meeting shall be prepared by the Chairperson and circulated to all the Members.
- b) The minutes should accurately reflect the proceedings of the General Meeting and the discussions by the Members. Objections raised by a Member shall be recorded in the minutes.
- c) A Member shall communicate to the Chairperson and all Members any deficiencies and/or inaccuracies in the minutes within 7 (seven) days of receipt of the minutes. The Chairperson shall make corrections, if necessary, and circulate the revised minutes to the Members.
- d) The minutes shall be placed for approval of the Members in the next General Meeting.

14. THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

14.1. Composition

The Executive Committee shall be composed of the following members ("**EC Members**"):

- a) the office bearers of JFI, namely the (A) President, (B) ~~General~~ Secretary General, (C) Treasurer, ~~(D) 2 (two) Vice-Presidents. and (E) 4 (four) Joint Secretaries, out of which 2 (two) Joint Secretaries shall be women~~; who all shall be elected by the General Body ("**Office Bearers**").
- b) 5 (five) other EC Mmembers, who shall be elected by the General Body. Out of these, 2 (two) positions shall be reserved for women.
- c) 24 (fourtwo) members of the Athletes' Commission - 12 (onetwo) female members and 12 (onetwo) male members, as nominated by the Athletes' Commission.
- d) 2 (two) ~~eminent~~ Judokas of Outstanding Merit – 1 (one) female member and 1 (one) male member, who shall be elected by the General Body as appointed by the Executive Committee.

- e) Any 1 (one) of all the Indian members or Indian office bearers of the International Judo Federation, as selected by the General Body. -

14.2. Functions, powers and duties

The functions, powers and duties of the Executive Committee shall be as follows:

- a) To conduct the business of JFI during the interval between the meetings of the General Body and report all the decisions and actions to the General Body, to which the Executive Committee is accountable.

b) To ensure affiliation of State/UT Associations with JFI.

- ~~b)c)~~ To consider and approve the President's Report -on the working of JFI, the audited accounts and the annual budget estimates and present the same to the General Body for approval.

- ~~e)d)~~ To consider names of Auditor(s) and terms of their engagement and propose the same to the General Body for approval.

- ~~e)e)~~ To propose removal of the Auditor if the circumstances so warrant.

- ~~e)f)~~ To consider names of members of Ombudsman and terms of their engagement and propose the same to the General Body for approval.

- ~~f)g)~~ To consider and approve the long term development plan for the sport of Judo and present the same to the General Body for approval.

- ~~e)h)~~ To propose removal of any member of the Ombudsman, if the circumstances so warrant.

- ~~h)i)~~ To consider and approve the annual calendar of competition and events and present the same to the General Body for approval.

- ~~i)j)~~ To initiate and recommend to the General Body different schemes for the promotion and development of Judo.

- ~~j)k)~~ To constitute sub-committees within the Executive Committee with specific tasks assigned to them.

- ~~k)l)~~ To decide the officials, entourage, staff etc. who will accompany the Judokas in national and international competitions/ tours.

- ~~h)m)~~ To organise the National Judo Championship in all age categories annually and award the official championship title.

- ~~m)n)~~ To collect, procure, accept and receive subscriptions, donations, sports goods or assistance in kind, gifts and endowments.

- ~~n)o)~~ To manage, supervise, and administer the funds and properties of JFI.

- ~~e)p)~~ To enter into, vary, carry out and cancel contracts on behalf of JFI.

- ~~p~~)q) To purchase, administer, transfer or sell movable or immovable properties for and on behalf of JFI.
- ~~q~~)r) To employ/engage various officers, employees, specialists, experts and/or personnel for the purposes of running and administration of JFI; to remunerate them for their services in accordance with applicable law; and to remove/terminate, dismiss, suspend and/or take other appropriate disciplinary action against such officers, employees or personnel.
- ~~r~~)s) To take penal action against a Judo Athlete/Official pursuant to the recommendations of the Athletes' Disciplinary Committee.
- t) To prepare and publish the roster of Judokas of Outstanding Merit in accordance with the procedure prescribed under the National Sports Act.
- ~~s~~)u) To mediate issues between Members.
- ~~t~~)v) To interact and consult with the Athletes' Commission regarding issues concerning Judokas.
- w) To appoint observers for the elections and meetings of Full Members and Associate Members.
- ~~u~~)x) To constitute an election panel consisting of retired government officers having adequate experience of conduct of elections under the Representation of People Act, 1951 to oversee the free and fair elections of the executive committees of the Full Members and Associate Members.
- ~~v~~)y) To institute or defend any action or proceedings for or against JFI or against any Office-Bearer or employee of the JFI.
- ~~w~~)z) To interpret the Rules and Regulations of JFI.
- ~~x~~)aa) To frame policies, and rules/ procedures generally for the management of the affairs of JFI.
- ~~y~~)bb) To recommend Bye-laws to the General Body.
- ~~z~~)cc) To raise loans for JFI.
- ~~aa~~)dd) To delegate any of its powers to any (special purpose) committee/ commission.
- ~~bb~~)ee) To decide on all issues which have not been placed under the authority of any other Body of JFI, subject to ratification by the General Body.
- ~~cc~~)ff) To ensure that JFI maintains its recognition as an NSF and maintains its affiliation with the International Judo Foundation, the Indian Olympic Association and other national and international sports bodies.

~~de)gg)~~ To communicate to the International Judo Federation the number of Members and black belts in JFI each year on September 30th.

~~ee)hh)~~ To inform the International Judo Federation, each time, about any amendment to JFI's Rules and Regulations or change to its list of Members and EC Members.

~~ff)ii)~~ To designate delegates for the International Judo Federation Congress.

~~gg)jj)~~ To submit a report to the International Judo Federation on the utilisation of funds received by JFI from the International Judo Federation and/or the International Olympic Committee.

~~hh)kk)~~ To discharge the functions, exercise the powers and perform the duties as provided in these Rules and Regulations.

~~ii)ll)~~ To do all such acts and things as are incidental and conducive to the doing of the forgoing acts or and/or the Objects of JFI.

14.3. Tenure of EC Members

- a) Except as provided hereinafter, the tenure of all EC Members shall be 4 (four) years.
- b) The tenure of the Indian member(s) and office bearer(s) of the International Judo Federation on the Executive Committee shall be the same as the tenure of his/her membership or office as an office bearer, as the case maybe, of International Judo Federation.

14.4. Eligibility conditions and restrictions on terms of EC Member

- a) A person shall be ineligible to be an EC Member, if, the person:
 - i. is subject to a Disqualification Event.
 - ii. holds any office or post in a sports or athletic association or federation, or Sports Board (except JFI and State/UT Association), or is a member of the executive body (called by whatever name) of such association / federation, and fails to demit such office/post or renounce such membership within 3 (three) days of becoming an EC Member.

Provided that this condition shall not apply if the person is holding a post/office in, or membership of the executive body of, the Indian Olympic Association or International Judo Federation in his/her capacity as a representative of JFI or if the person is a member of the National Olympic Committee.

- iii. has been an EC Member for a cumulative period of 12 (twelve years) in any capacity whatsoever.

- iv. is an Immediate Relative of any other EC Member.
- v. is an Immediate Relative of any person who was as an EC Member, provided that this condition will operate till 4 (four) years from the date of the concerned EC Member demitting office.
- vi. is / has been associated with the same State/UT Association or Sports Board as another EC Member.
- vii. has not attained 25 (twenty-five) years of age.
- ~~vi.~~—
- b) A person shall not be qualified to contest for election or seek nomination to, the posts of the President or the Secretary General or the Treasurer, unless such person is a Judoka of Outstanding Merit, or, has previously served as a member for at least 1 (one) full term in the Executive Committee of JFI or as the President, Secretary General or Treasurer in a Full Member. The General Secretary shall be a Judoka who has taken part in the senior category of the National Judo Championship, National Games, Commonwealth Games or Olympics. The Treasurer shall be a chartered accountant or person having a degree of Bachelor of Commerce or any other equivalent degree.
- ~~e) The eminent Judokas appointed by the Executive Committee should be athletes who have won medals at Olympic Games or other international competitions or coaches whose athletes/ teams have won medals at Olympic Games or other international competitions. Further eligibility criteria shall be as Prescribed.~~
- c) A person seeking election as an EC Member shall have to be proposed by a Full Member/Athlete Member and seconded by another Full Member/Athlete Member. It is clarified that this requirement shall not apply to EC Members who are nominated by the Athletes' Commission.
- d) Candidates seeking election as Office Bearers and EC Members elected by the General Body, and candidates seeking nomination to the Executive Committee by the Athletes' Commission, shall be required to submit their vision document/manifesto before the election/nomination.
- e) A person may be an EC Member (irrespective, of the post they hold therein or the capacity in which they have been appointed) ~~may hold such position~~ for 2 (two) consecutive terms of up to 4 (four) years each, upon the completion of which, such person shall be eligible to become an EC Member again only after serving a cooling-off period of 4 (four) years.
- f) Rules 14.4(a) and (e) shall have retrospective effect, i.e., the period already served by a person or his/her Immediate Relative in their capacity as officer

bearer and/or member of the executive committee of JFI prior to the Effective Date, shall be included for the purposes of calculating periods set out in these Rules in their application to such persons.

g) An Office Bearer shall be re-elected as an Office Bearer only if he/she secures 2/3rd (two-thirds) of the votes cast.

g)h) Where a person, who is already an EC Member, ceases to meet the eligibility criteria as provided in these Rules and Regulations, he/she shall demit (or, in the event of failure to do so, shall be deemed to have demitted) his/her position immediately.

14.5. Vacancy

- a) Any vacancy in the Executive Committee due to death, resignation, removal or ineligibility of an EC Member shall be filled up for the remaining period his/her term:
 - i. in the case of an elected EC Member, by elections at a General Meeting to be held within 50 (fifty) days of the vacancy arising.
 - ii. in the case of an EC Member ~~appointed by the Executive Committee or~~ nominated by the Athletes' Commission, by ~~the Executive Committee/~~ Athletes' Commission appointing/nominating a substitute within 20 (twenty) days of the vacancy arising.

14.6. Meetings of the Executive Committee

- a) An EC Meeting shall be held at such frequency as may be necessary to discharge its duties, but in any case, at least once every 3 (three) months. A meeting of the Executive Committee is referred to herein as an "**EC Meeting**". The EC Meeting shall be convened by the ~~General Secretary~~Secretary General. The meeting shall be held at such time and place as the Executive Committee may decide.
- b) An EC Meeting shall be convened on a requisition to that effect being made to the Executive Committee by not less than 4 (four) EC Members. Any such requisition shall express the object of the meeting proposed to be called. Such meeting shall be convened by the ~~General Secretary~~Secretary General within 2 (two) days of receipt of the requisition, by giving notice in accordance with Rule 14.7.
- c) Where the ~~General Secretary~~Secretary General fails to convene an EC Meeting in accordance with Rule 14.6(a) and Rule 14.6(b), then 4 (four) EC Members may call for and convene such a meeting by giving notice in accordance with Rule 14.7. In such a case, the EC Meeting shall be held only at the

Headquarters of JFI or if the same is not available, then at another location in NCT of Delhi.

14.7. Notice and Agenda for an EC Meeting

- a) For an EC Meeting, 15 (fifteen) days' notice shall be given to all EC Members. The notice shall be accompanied by an agenda setting out the business to be transacted at the meeting along with explanatory notes and documents relevant for discussing the business to be transacted.
- b) Any EC Member may seek addition of an agenda item up to 10 (ten) days before the date of the meeting by sending the same to the ~~General Secretary~~Secretary General. After receiving the additional agenda items proposed by the EC Members, the ~~General Secretary~~Secretary General shall circulate a revised agenda to all EC Members, not later than 7 (seven) days before the date of the General Meeting.
- c) An EC Meeting may be called at a shorter notice if consented to by all EC Members. In such a case, business items other than those specified in the agenda with the notice, shall not be raised at the meeting.

14.8. Quorum, Chairperson, Voting at the EC Meeting

- a) The quorum for an EC Meeting shall be 8 (eight) EC Members out of which at least 1 (one) EC Member should be an Office Bearer and 1 (one) EC Member should be the nominee of the Athletes' Commission. Where any business related to a financial matter is to be transacted at a meeting, the presence of the Treasurer shall be mandatory to constitute valid quorum. The EC Members may invite the Auditor / its representative to attend an EC Meeting if the agenda involves a matter pertaining to finances of JFI.
- b) The EC Members shall be personally present at the meetings of the Executive Committee and shall not be represented through any authorised person or proxy.
- c) An EC Meeting may be held through video-conferencing. EC Members shall be permitted to join an EC Meeting through video-conferencing.
- d) No business shall be transacted at the meeting unless the quorum requisite is present at the commencement of the business of the meeting. If the requisite quorum is not present, then the meeting held shall be invalid and all resolutions passed, or discussions made therein shall be without any force.
- e) The President shall preside over the EC Meeting as the Chairperson and in his/her absence, the ~~General Secretary~~Secretary General. In the absence of both the President and the ~~General Secretary~~Secretary General, the EC

Members present shall select a Chairperson from amongst themselves. The Chairperson shall not have any casting vote.

- f) At the EC Meeting, each EC Member shall exercise 1 (one) vote. The Chairperson shall record how each EC Member has voted. Decisions at the EC Meetings shall be taken by simple majority of votes of those present.
- g) In case of a tie in votes, the concerned business item(s) shall be put to vote again after one hour, and if the need arises, the EC Meeting shall stand adjourned by one hour to enable the second vote. If there is a tie in votes even in the second vote, then the business item shall be stood over for consideration at the next EC Meeting.

14.9. Resolution by circulation

- a) The Executive Committee may pass a resolution through circulation on all matters on which it can pass a resolution in an EC Meeting, provided that such resolution:
 - i. has been circulated in draft form, together with the relevant documents, if any, to all the EC Members in advance.
 - ii. is approved by a majority of the EC Members.
- b) A resolution so passed shall be as valid and effective as a resolution duly passed at a duly held EC Meeting.
- c) All resolutions passed by circulation shall be taken on record at the next EC Meeting.

14.10. Minutes of the EC Meeting

- a) The minutes recording the proceedings of the EC Meeting shall be prepared by the Chairperson and circulated to all EC Members, within 3 (three) days of the meeting.
- b) The minutes should accurately reflect the proceedings of the EC Meeting and the discussions by the EC Members. Objections raised by an EC Member shall be recorded in the minutes.
- c) An EC Member shall communicate to the Chairperson and all EC Members any deficiencies and/or inaccuracies in the minutes within 5 (five) days of receipt of the minutes. The Chairperson shall make corrections, if necessary, and circulate the revised minutes to the EC Members.
- d) The minutes shall be placed for approval of the EC Members in the next EC Meeting.

14.11. Vote of no-confidence

- a) The Executive Committee shall be liable to dissolved if the General Body loses confidence in it and passes a vote of no-confidence at a General Meeting.
- b) A resolution for no-confidence against the Executive Committee:
 - i. shall be sponsored by Members having at least 1/3 (one-third) of the total votes in a General Meeting, with the Full Members constituting the voting majority;
 - ii. shall be considered at a General Meeting, including an Adjourned Meeting, where Members having at least $\frac{3}{4}$ (three-fourth) of the total votes in a General Meeting, with the Full Members constituting the voting majority, are present; and
 - iii. shall be passed only if supported by 2/3rd (two-thirds) majority of the total votes of the Members present at such General Meeting.
- c) After dissolution of the Executive Committee, new EC Members shall be selected as per the procedure provided in these Rules and Regulations. The persons who were members of the dissolved Executive Committee shall not be eligible for selection as EC Members for a period of 3 (three) years from the date of dissolution of the Executive Committee.

15. FUNCTIONS, POWERS AND DUTIES OF OFFICE BEARERS

15.1. The President

- a) Shall be the ~~—executive—~~head of JFI and responsible for overseeing the execution/ implementation of the Rules and Regulations, Bye-laws, policies and rules/ procedures to achieve Objects of JFI.
- b) Shall represent JFI towards third parties and sign documents on behalf of JFI.
- c) Shall liaise on behalf of JFI with the other National Sports Federations, the Indian Olympic Association, the International Judo Federation and other national and international sports bodies.
- d) Shall exercise superintendence and oversee the functioning of the General Body and the Executive Committee and guide JFI in all activities.
- e) Shall direct the Secretary to call meetings of the General Body and Executive Committee.
- f) Shall preside over all the meetings of the Executive Committee and General Body and other meetings of JFI, as required.
- g) In case of emergency, shall be authorised to sanction expenditure up to INR 2,00,000 (Indian Rupees two lakh) for any item not included in the budget. Such expenditure shall be placed before the Executive Committee for ratification.

- h) Shall ensure compliance with the National Sports Code, government directions, applicable law and other documents which govern JFI.
- i) Shall ensure that the financial position of JFI is sound and no unauthorised expenses have taken place.
- j) Shall, in case of emergency, have full power to issue necessary order and take necessary steps, which shall subsequently be confirmed by the Executive Committee or General Body, as the case may be.
- k) Shall discharge the functions, exercise the powers and perform the duties as provided in these Rules and Regulations and/or as directed by the Executive Committee and/or the General Body.
- l) Shall prepare every year the annual report on the working of JFI, called the 'President's Report', which shall provide for such matters as Prescribed, and place the same before the Executive Committee for approval.

15.2. ~~The General Secretary~~ Secretary General

- a) Shall be the head of administration of JFI and responsible for the execution/ implementation of the decisions of the General Body and Executive Committee, Rules and Regulations, Bye-laws, policies and rules/ procedures to achieve Objects of JFI.
- ~~a)~~ b) Shall convene all meetings of the General Body (on behalf of the Executive Committee) and Executive Committee.
- ~~b)~~ c) Shall be authorised to determine the dates, venue and time of the meetings of the Executive Committee and General Body and any other meetings as deemed fit to fulfil the aims and objects of JFI.
- ~~c)~~ d) Shall transact all official work and day-to-day affairs of JFI.
- ~~d)~~ e) Shall act as the liaison between JFI and its Members and between its Members.
- ~~e)~~ f) Shall be responsible for carrying out all correspondences in the name of JFI / its President or otherwise correspond as directed by the President.
- ~~f)~~ g) Subject to direction of the President, shall sign documents on behalf of JFI.
- ~~g)~~ h) Shall be in-charge of all records and documents (including the register of members, players, officials, etc., minutes of meetings) as may be necessary for the smooth and efficient working of JFI.
- ~~h)~~ i) Shall have custody of and maintain in proper order and condition, all documents, trophies, souvenirs and seals, equipment, uniforms, and insignia of JFI and documents of all moveable and immoveable properties of JFI and shall take annual stock of all such properties.

- h) Shall exercise general supervision on all staff and specialists/ experts employed by JFI.
- i) Shall prepare every year the annual calendar of competition and events and place the same before the Executive Committee for approval.
- j) Shall prepare long term development plan for the sport of Judo and place the same before the Executive Committee for approval.
- k) Shall collect or cause to be collected all subscriptions and fees and bring in with due diligence all other monies and dues payable to JFI.
- l) Shall ensure that accounts of JFI have been properly maintained by the Treasurer and are regularly audited.
- m) Shall be entitled to incur any legitimate expenditure on behalf of JFI not exceeding INR 1,00,000 (Indian Rupees one lakh) that shall be subject to confirmation by the Executive Committee at its next meeting.
- n) Shall oversee the functioning and progress of various committees and commissions.
- o) Shall be empowered to call for any papers and information from the Members, Judokas, Judo Athletes/Officials, officials, licensed academies/ clubs or anyone associated with the sport, which is necessary for the disposal of any matter and to perform such other duties as authorised in these Rules and Regulations.
- p) Shall discharge the functions, exercise the powers and perform the duties as provided in these Rules and Regulations and/or as directed by the Executive Committee and/or the General Body.

15.3. The Treasurer

- a) Shall be ~~in charge of~~ the custodian of all the funds, finance and accounts of JFI.
- b) Shall maintain and keep proper books and accounts in respect of all sums of money received and expended by JFI and its assets and liabilities.
- c) Shall maintain an inventory of the property and stock (including equipment and uniform) of JFI and submit the same along with the accounts.
- d) Shall receive moneys due to JFI and maintain proper accounts of the same and issue appropriate receipts.
- e) Shall deposit all moneys as and when received on behalf of JFI in its bank account without delay.

- f) Shall make all payments on behalf JFI after the connected bills and vouchers have been duly checked by him/ her. Payments up to INR 1,00,000 shall be made after approval of the ~~General Secretary~~Secretary General and more than that, after approval of the Executive Committee.
- g) Shall prepare and submit to the ~~General Secretary~~Secretary General the list of all Members who have defaulted on the payment of their Admission Fee / Annual Fees and other dues.
- h) Shall prepare and place the annual budget before the Executive Committee for its approval.
- i) Shall prepare the statement of accounts of the income and expenditure of JFI and have the same audited. Shall present the audited accounts before the Executive Committee for approval.
- j) Shall assist the Auditor(s) in the auditing of the accounts and explain to him/ her such items and entries, which he/ she may be called for.
- k) May keep cash not exceeding INR 20,000 (Indian Rupees twenty thousand) for defraying urgent expenses.
- l) Shall discharge the functions, exercise the powers and perform the duties as provided in these Rules and Regulations and/or as directed by the Executive Committee and/or the General Body.

~~15.4. The Vice-Presidents~~

- ~~a) Shall discharge the functions, exercise the powers and perform the duties as Prescribed and/or as determined by the Executive Committee.~~

~~15.5. The Joint Secretaries~~

- ~~a) Shall act under the instructions of the Secretary, and in his/her absence, under the instructions of the President.~~

16. ATHLETES' BODY

- 16.1. The Athletes' Body aim to is to provide a platform through which the Judokas can participate in the governance and administration of JFI. Such participation shall be achieved by the Athletes' Body by:
 - a) electing the Athlete Members in the General Body; and
 - b) electing the AC Members, who shall interface with the Executive Committee.
- 16.2. The Athletes' Body shall be composed of 2 (two) Judokas (one male and one female) from each State/ Union Territory. The Judokas from a State/ Union Territory shall be elected by and from amongst all Judokas domiciled or working in that State/ Union Territory who have taken part in the senior category of the National Judo

Championship, National Games, Commonwealth Games or Olympics in the past 3 (three) years and are not subject to any Disqualification Event.

- 16.3. The election of Judokas for the Athletes' Body from each State/ Union Territory shall be conducted by the respective State/UT Association which shall send the names of the elected Judokas to the Athletes Commission and the Executive Committee.
- 16.4. Members of Athletes' Body shall have a tenure of 3 (three) years and shall be eligible for reappointment. Any vacancies arising shall be filled by an election as provided hereinabove.
- 16.5. It is clarified that a Judoka shall automatically cease to be member of the Athletes' Body when he/she becomes subject to any Disqualification Event.
- 16.6. A list of all members of the Athletes' Body shall be prepared and maintained by the Athletes' Commission, and in its absence, by the Executive Committee.
- 16.7. The elections of Athlete Members and AC Members shall be conducted by the Athletes' Commission, and in its absence, by the Executive Committee.
- 16.8. Subject to the Rules and Regulations, the Athletes' Body shall be free to determine its own procedure for conduct of its business, including holding of meetings and voting procedures, failing which, the Executive Committee shall determine such procedure. The procedure so determined ought to be broadly in line with the procedures provided for the General Body in these Rules and Regulations and By-laws.
- 16.9. The Athletes' Body shall receive a reasonable budget from JFI to conduct its business. The Athletes' Body shall be free to use the office(s) of JFI, including its Headquarters for conducting its business.

17. ATHLETES' COMMISSION

- 17.1. The Athletes' Commission shall be composed of 6 (six) members – 3 (three) males and 3 (three) females, elected by the Athletes' Body from amongst its member Judokas ("**AC Members**").
- 17.2. The functions of the Athletes' Commission shall be as follows:
 - a) To ensure communication between the JFI and Judokas.
 - b) To serve as a source of feedback and advice to the Executive Committee with regard to both current and contemplated policies of JFI.
 - c) To advise the Executive Committee on the perspective and needs of Judokas on, *inter alia*: (i) talent development; (ii) training and competition schedules; (iii) redress of Judoka grievances; (iv) selection criteria; (v) logistical and administrative support; and (vi) athlete support and welfare beyond competitive sports career.

- d) To nominate EC Members in accordance with Rules and Regulations.
 - e) To liaise with the athletes' commissions of other sports organisations, including that of the Indian Olympic Association and the International Judo Federation.
 - f) To manage and administer the funds of the Athletes' Body.
- 17.3. The term of the AC Members shall be 4 (four) years. The conditions and limitations applicable to the eligibility and tenure of the AC Members shall be the same as set out in Rules 14.4(a), (e) and (h), with the modification that the reference to 'EC Member' in those Rules shall be read as 'AC Member'.
- 17.4. An AC Member shall not be an Athlete Member of JFI.
- 17.5. Any vacancy in the Athletes' Commission due to death, resignation, removal or ineligibility of an AC Member shall be filled up for the remaining period his/her term by election by the Athletes' Body at a meeting to be held within 50 (fifty) days of the vacancy arising.
- 17.6. Subject to the Rules and Regulations, the Athletes' Body shall be free to determine procedure for conduct of business, including holding of meetings and voting procedures, of the Athletes' Commission, failing which, the Executive Committee shall determine such procedure. The procedure so determined ought to be broadly in line with the procedures provided for the Executive Committee in these Rules and Regulations and Bye-laws.
- 17.7. The Athletes' Commission shall be free to use the office(s) of JFI, including its headquarters for conducting its business.
- 17.8. The Athletes Commission shall be liable to be dissolved if a vote of no-confidence is passed against it by the Athletes' Body. In this regard, the procedure provided in Rule 14.11 shall also apply to no-confidence votes by the Athletes' Body against the Athletes' Commission.

18. SELECTION COMMITTEE

- 18.1. The Selection Committee shall be responsible for framing the procedure and criteria for the selection of Judokas and selecting Judokas for participation in various national and international competitions.
- 18.2. The selection procedure and criteria shall be placed for approval of the Executive Committee.
- 18.3. The Selection Committee shall be composed of 3 (three) members, who shall be appointed by the Executive Committee for a term of 1 (one) year. The members should be retired Judokas who are not subject to any Disqualification Event and

having such other qualification as may be Prescribed and as set out in any law of government directions.

19. TECHNICAL COUNCIL

- 19.1. The Technical Council shall be responsible for identification, training and certification of Judo coaches and referees in India.
- 19.2. The composition of the Technical Council and the conditions of eligibility and terms of appointment of its members shall be as Prescribed.

20. REMUNERATION AND GENERAL DISQUALIFICATION

No member of any Body of JFI, excluding the members of the Ombudsman, shall receive any compensation or bonus of any kind in consideration for services or for the performance of duties as a member of a Body of JFI, provided that, it shall be appropriate to reimburse a member of a Body of JFI for travelling, accommodation and other justified expenses incurred in the carrying out of functions.

21. PROFESSIONAL MANAGERS

- 21.1. The Executive Committee shall engage/employ professional managers for the purpose of managing the day-to-day administration, operations, accounts and finances, human resources, legal affair and media affairs of JFI, on such terms as it may think fit.
- 21.2. The managers engaged/employed shall have the requisite qualifications for the role for which they are engaged/employed.
- 21.3. The powers, functions and duties of the managers may be as determined by the Executive Committee by way of published rules.
- 21.4. The engagement/employment of such managers shall be subject to ratification by the General Body.

PART IV: ELECTIONS

22. PROCEDURE FOR ELECTIONS

- 22.1. The election to all elected posts in the Executive Committee shall be conducted in accordance with the National Sports Act and the rules notified thereunder from time to time. ~~General Body shall Prescribe rules of procedure for the elections to the Executive Committee in line with the Model Election Guidelines published along with the National Sports Code and subject to suitable modifications in accordance with these Rules and Regulations. Voting for elections shall be by secret ballot.~~
- 22.2. Such rules will apply also to elections of the Athlete Member and to the Athletes' Commission, with suitable modifications as may be required. ~~Any amendments to~~

~~the procedure adopted shall be made at least 3 (three) months prior to the elections.~~

23. THE ELECTORAL OFFICER

23.1. At least ~~four weeks~~ 60 (sixty) days prior to the General Meeting or meeting of the Athletes' Body at which an election is to be held, the Executive Committee shall appoint an electoral officer ("**Electoral Officer**"). ~~on such terms and conditions as may be Prescribed.~~

23.2. The Electoral Officer shall be appointed from the National Sports Election Panel as constituted under the National Sports Act. Till such time the National Sports Election Panel is notified and constituted, t~~The Electoral Officer shall be a retired judge or a retired officer of the Indian Administrative Service~~Chief Election Commissioner, Election Commissioner or Deputy Election Commissioner with adequate experience of conduct of elections under the Representation of the People Act, 1951.

23.3. The Electoral Officer shall oversee and supervise the entire election process including scrutiny of the electoral rolls, with all candidatures being subject to his/her scrutiny. His role shall commence from the date of his appointment and shall cease with the declaration of the result.

23.4. Any dispute or objection in relation to the election, including in relation to candidacy, disqualification, eligibility to vote, or the admission or rejection of a vote in the elections, shall be raised before the Electoral Officer at the earliest instance. The Electoral officer shall have the power to decide such a dispute/objection and issue necessary directions. Such decision shall be subject to a challenge only before the Ombudsman and only after the declaration of the result.

~~23.4.~~23.5. The Executive Committee shall provide the requisite number of administrative staff as specified by the Electoral Officer to assist such officer to conduct elections to the Executive Committee.

PART V: ACCOUNTS AND AUDIT

24. ACCOUNTS

24.1. True and fair accounts shall be kept by the Treasurer of all moneys received and expended by JFI and the matters in respect of which such receipts and expenditure take place and of all assets, credits and liabilities of JFI during the Financial Year.

24.2. The Athletes' Commission shall maintain and provide a proper account of all money allocated to the Athletes' Body during the Financial Year.

24.3. JFI shall employ / retain a chartered accountant having at least 10 (ten) years' experience to maintain the accounts of JFI.

- 24.4. The accounts shall be prepared and maintained in accordance with accounting standards notified under S.133 of the Companies Act 2013. The accounting period shall be the same as the Financial Year.
- 24.5. The accounts of JFI shall be audited by an external Auditor.
- 24.6. The accounts of JFI shall be provided to the International Judo Federation, the Indian Olympic Association and the Government of India on a request being made to that effect.

25. AUDITOR(S)

- 25.1. The General Body shall, at every Annual General Meeting, appoint one or more Auditors to hold office for a 1 (one) year period to audit the accounts of JFI and shall fix their remuneration. The Auditor shall be eligible for reappointment by the General Body. The Auditor shall have at least 15 (fifteen) year experience.
- 25.2. The Auditor(s) shall have the right of access at all times to the books of accounts, vouchers and any other documents relating to the accounts of JFI and shall be entitled to obtain from the Office-Bearers and Bodies of JFI such information and explanation as may be necessary in the discharge of his/their duties.
- 25.3. The Auditor(s) shall provide an opinion on the financial statements of JFI and recommendations on the financial controls within the system, which shall be contained in a financial report.
- 25.4. Auditor(s) shall also ascertain how the funds of JFI are being utilized by the respective Members. It will be the responsibility of the Auditor(s) to verify the statements made by the Members in this regard and to give findings, which shall be contained in a compliance report.
- 25.5. Both the financial report and the compliance report of the Auditor(s) shall be considered at the Annual General Meeting.

26. BANK ACCOUNT

- 26.1. JFI shall maintain account(s) in such scheduled bank, nationalized bank or other banks, as may be approved by the Executive Committee.
- 26.2. The account(s) shall be maintained in the name of JFI only. All moneys to paid or received shall be paid or received from/into the account of JFI only. No money shall be paid or received by any other person/entity on behalf of JFI.
- 26.3. The account(s) shall be jointly operated by any 2 (two) of the following three: the Treasurer, the President, and the ~~General Secretary~~Secretary General, with the signature of the Treasurer being mandatory.

PART VI: TRANSPARENCY, CONFLICT OF INTEREST AND ACCOUNTABILITY

27. MAINTENANCE OF RECORDS

27.1. *Inter-alia*, JFI shall consolidate and maintain the following records in physical form and soft copy (to be made available at the Headquarters) and upload the same on the website of JFI as well:

- a) The Memorandum, Rules and Regulations and Bye-laws.
- b) Resolutions, minutes, policies, orders and rules/ procedures, proceedings and decisions of all Bodies of JFI.
- c) Register of Members and Judo Athletes/ Officials.
- d) Details and composition of the various Bodies of JFI, their reports of work done, financial outlay and expenditure.
- e) Qualifications of members of the Executive Committee, Athletes' Commission, Selection Committee, Athletes' Disciplinary Committee, Administration Disciplinary Committee, Ombudsman and other committees.
- f) The audited accounts, balance sheets, profit & loss accounts, annual reports/President's Reports and annual calendar of competition and events.
- g) The financial and compliance reports of the Auditor(s).
- h) Declarations of conflict of interest.
- i) Notice and results of various competitions and events.
- j) All payments and expenditures made by JFI which are in excess of INR 25,00,000 (Indian Rupees twenty-five lakh), along with details of such expenditures.
- k) All notices on or behalf of JFI including tenders for goods and services, for contractual arrangements and the like.
- l) All other relevant documents and such other documents as may be Prescribed.

27.2. The records of JFI shall be open to the general public to access, inspect and they shall be entitled to obtain copies thereof, unless the record concerned has already been uploaded on the website of JFI.

28. RIGHT TO INFORMATION

28.1. JFI shall be subject to and comply with the Right to Information Act 2005.

29. CONFLICT OF INTEREST

29.1. A conflict of interest may take any of the following forms as far as any individual associated with the JFI is concerned ("**Conflict of Interest**"):

- a) Direct or Indirect Interest: When JFI or a Member enter into contractual arrangements with entities in which the individual concerned or his/her

relative, partner or close associate has an interest. This is to include case where family members, partners or close associates are in positions that may, or may be seen to compromise an individual's participation, performance and discharge of roles.

- b) Roles compromised: When the individual holds two separate or distinct posts or positions under JFI or a Member, the functions of which would require the one to be beholden to the other, or in opposition thereof.
- c) Commercial conflicts: When the individual enters into endorsement contracts or other professional engagements with third parties, the discharge of which would compromise the individual's primary obligation to the sport or allow for a perception that the purity of the game stands compromised.
- d) Prior relationship: When the individual has a direct or indirect independent commercial engagement with a vendor or service provider in the past, which is now to be engaged by or on behalf of JFI or its Member.
- e) Position of influence: When the individual occupies a post that calls for decisions of governance, management or selection to be made, and where a friend, relative or close affiliate is in the zone of consideration or subject to such decision-making, control or management.

29.2. A Conflict of Interest may be either tractable or intractable:

- a) Tractable conflicts are those that are resolvable or permissible or excusable through recusal of the individual concerned and/or with full disclosure of the interest involved.
- b) Intractable conflicts are those that cannot be resolved through disclosure and recusal and would necessitate the removal of the individual from a post or position occupied so that the conflict can cease to exist.

29.3. Within a period of 15 (fifteen) days of taking any office under JFI, every individual shall disclose in writing to the Executive Committee any existing or potential event that may be deemed to cause a Conflict of Interest, and the same shall be uploaded on the website of JFI. As far as incumbents are concerned, the disclosure may be made within 30 (thirty) days of the Effective Date.

30. ONE PERSON ONE POST

30.1. Except as expressly provided in these Rules and Regulations, no individual shall occupy more than 1 (one) position simultaneously in JFI.

30.2. It is clarified that no individual may occupy more than one of the following posts at a single point of time except where permitted under these Rules and Regulations:

- a) Judoka (Current)

- b) Team official
- c) Commentator
- d) Match official
- e) Electoral Officer
- f) Auditor
- g) Managers
- h) Service provider (legal, financial, etc.)
- i) Contractual entity (broadcast, security, contractor, etc.)
- j) Owner of a Judo academy

31. ACCOUNTABILITY

- 31.1. All Judo Athletes/Officials, members of the Ombudsman and Administrative Disciplinary Committee, shall conduct themselves with the highest degree of propriety and in the best interests of the sport of Judo and JFI.
- 31.2. They shall ensure that they act in accordance with and comply with the Code of Ethics [and Safe Sports Policy](#) at all times.
- 31.3. All such persons shall be accountable for their actions/omissions to JFI.
- 31.4. All such persons shall be liable to be punished / other suitable action for any Misconduct on their part.

32. FAIRNESS IN ENGAGEMENTS AND EMPLOYMENTS

- 32.1. A fair, transparent and open process shall be followed while awarding any contracts or while engaging/employing persons.
- 32.2. Details of such process shall be widely publicised and also uploaded on the website of JFI.

PART VII: ENQUIRIES, DISPUTES AND ADJUDICATION

33. ATHLETES' DISCIPLINARY COMMITTEE

- 33.1. The Athletes' Disciplinary Committee shall be responsible for enquiry into, and recommending suitable action [to the Executive Committee](#), for any case of Misconduct by Judo Athlete/Official.
- 33.2. The Athletes' Disciplinary Committee shall be composed of up to 3 (three) members, who shall be appointed by the Executive Committee as and when any case requiring an enquiry of the Athletes' Disciplinary Committee under Rule 33.1.

- 33.3. The members should be senior retired Judokas who are not subject to any Disqualification Event, are not members of the Executive Committee and have such other qualification as may be Prescribed.
- 33.4. The Athletes' Disciplinary Committee shall function independently from the Executive Committee.

34. INTERNAL COMPLAINTS COMMITTEE

34.1. An Internal Complaints Committee shall be constituted by ~~JFI~~ the Executive Committee in accordance with and for the purposes of discharging the functions under the Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013

~~34.1.~~

35. OMBUDSMAN

- 35.1. The Ombudsman shall be the supreme adjudication authority of JFI.
- 35.2. It shall be composed of 1 (one) member, who shall be appointed by the General Body for a tenure of 4 (four) years, which shall be renewable, subject to a maximum of 3 (three) terms. The members should be retired judges of the Supreme Court or High Courts and have such other qualification as may be Prescribed. The members shall be entitled to such remuneration and allowances as may be fixed keeping with the dignity and stature of the office.
- 35.3. The Ombudsman shall adjudicate:
- a) Any grievance against any order, decision, conduct or any other action / omission of:
 - i. any other Body of JFI (excluding the Athletes' Disciplinary Committee);
 - ii. any Members;
 - iii. any member of any Body of JFI or any person employed for associated with JFI in an administrative capacity; and
 - iv. any Judo Athlete/Official;

which order, decision, conduct or any other action / omission is alleged to be (i) in violation of these Rules and Regulations, the Bye-laws, the policies of JFI/Bodies of JFI, the rules and procedure of JFI/Bodies of JFI, applicable law, and other documents and or stipulations which apply to and govern JFI; (ii) prejudicial to the interest of JFI and/or the sport of Judo; (iii) contrary to the Objects of JFI; (iv) a failure to discharge functions and duties and/or dereliction of duties; (v) an improper and malafide exercise of power; and/or (vi) Misconduct (only with respect to Natural Persons).

Provided that, any grievance which falls within the domain of the Athletes' Disciplinary Committee shall be first adjudicated by that body, unless the same has not been validly constituted or is not functioning.

Provided further that, any grievance against a Full Member or an Associate Member shall be first adjudicated under the disputes redressal mechanism of such Member, unless such mechanism is not provided, not validly constituted or not functioning.

- b) Any disputes between (a) two or more Members; (b) two or more Bodies of JFI (excluding the Ombudsman); ~~and~~ (c) within a Full Member; and (d) disputes between one or more Members on one side and JFI on the other side.

Provided that, any disputes within a Full Member shall be first adjudicated under the disputes redressal mechanism of such Member, unless such mechanism is not provided, not validly constituted or not functioning.

- c) Any issue regarding the legality of the obtainment/nomination/appointment and/or continuance of a person's position (including elected position) within any Body of JFI (excluding the Ombudsman), including where such position is alleged to have been obtained by fraud, misrepresentation and/or concealment or where it is alleged that the person has ceased to meet the eligibility criteria as set out in these Rules and Regulations and Bye-laws.
- d) Any dispute concerning elections within JFI/Bodies of JFI, subject to power of the Electoral Officer to first decide such dispute. Provided that, any such dispute shall only be entertained after the declaration of the result of the election.
- e) Any challenge to an order of the final adjudicating authority of the Full Members and Associate Members.
- f) Any appeal against the order of the Athletes' Disciplinary Committee.
- g) Any other dispute or grievance which does not fall in the jurisdiction of any other adjudicatory authority, excluding any dispute or issue with respect to the eligibility/legality of obtaining/rejecting/continuing Membership.

36. GENERAL PROCEDURE AND STIPULATIONS

- 36.1. Any person / entity may bring a complaint before the Athletes' Disciplinary Committee and the Ombudsman. These Bodies of JFI may also take suo-moto cognizance of any issue which falls within their jurisdiction.
- 36.2. These Bodies of JFI, in the course of their enquiries, shall ensure compliance with principles of natural justice, giving all stakeholders a hearing. They shall have the power to take evidence, if necessary. The place of hearing shall be decided by these Bodies of JFI.

- 36.3. Subject to these Rules and Regulations and Bye-laws framed to regulate the procedure for conduct of business of these Bodies of JFI:
- a) the Ombudsman shall determine and frame its procedure for conduct of business.
 - b) the Executive Body shall determine and frame the procedure for conduct of business of the Athletes' Disciplinary Committee, failing which, the Athletes' Disciplinary Committee shall be free to determine such procedure.
- 36.4. The procedure so determined and framed shall be subject to ratification / modifications by the General Body. Such procedure shall be published on the website of JFI
- 36.5. These Bodies of JFI shall have the power to impose such punishment and penalties and direct such remedial and other measures, as they deem fit or as Prescribed. The punishment, penalties and remedial measures can include, monetary penalty, ban, suspension, removal from team, post, competition etc and restitution. However, they shall not have the power to grant any relief or issue any directions with respect to admission, suspension and removal from Membership.
- 36.6. These Bodies of JFI shall also have the power to impose interim measures such as suspension (except with respect to Membership).
- 36.7. The enquiry and adjudication by these Bodies of JFI ought to be completed within a period of 4 (four) months, failing which the interim measures shall cease to operate.
- 36.8. These Bodies of JFI shall have the power to interpret and apply these Rules and Regulations, the Bye-laws, the policies of JFI/Bodies of JFI, the rules and procedure of JFI/Bodies of JFI, applicable law, and other documents and or stipulations which apply to and govern JFI and the concerned parties.
- 36.9. The decision of the Athletes' Disciplinary Committee unless appealed before the Ombudsman, and the decision of the Ombudsman, shall be final and binding on all concerned parties.
- 36.10. The decisions of these Bodies of JFI shall be published on the website of JFI.
- 36.11. The Executive Committee shall be responsible for implementing the orders/recommendations of these Bodies.
- 36.12. The cause of action provided in this Part VII shall imply a corresponding obligation, duty, disqualification and/or disability on part of the person/ entity against whom the cause of action is brought.
- 36.13. Any member of any Body of JFI or any Judo Athlete/Official or other individual associated with JFI, who is found guilty and removed by JFI, shall forfeit all their

rights and privileges. ~~He or she shall not in future be entitled to hold any position or office or be admitted in any committee or any role in JFI.~~

36.14. Notwithstanding anything contained herein, the members of the Ombudsman and the Electoral Officer shall be subject to action only by the General Body.

37. ETHICS COMMITTEE

~~36.14.~~37.1. An Ethics Committee shall be constituted by the General Body for monitoring and ensuring compliance with the Code of Ethics. The General Body may delegate adjudicatory functions to the Ethics Committee for breach of Code of Ethics subject to the overall supervision of the Ombudsman.

~~**37. REFERENCE OF DISPUTES TO ARBITRATION COMMISSION OF INDIAN OLYMPIC ASSOCIATION**~~

~~37.1.~~ Any disputes between one or more Members on one side and JFI on the other side shall be referred for resolution to the arbitration commission set up by the Indian Olympic Association.

~~37.2.~~ All other disputes shall be resolved as per the mechanisms provided in these Rules and Regulations.

PART VII: MISCELLANEOUS

38. AMENDMENT TO MEMORANDUM AND RULES AND REGULATIONS

38.1. The Memorandum and Rules and Regulations can only be amended:

- a) at a General Meeting, including an Adjourned Meeting; where
- b) there is presence of Members having at least $\frac{3}{4}$ (three-fourth) of the total votes in a General Meeting, with the Full Members constituting the voting majority; and when
- c) the resolution for amendment is passed by $\frac{2}{3}$ rd (two-thirds) majority of the total votes of the Members present at such General Meeting.

39. BYE-LAWS

39.1. The General Body may, on the recommendation of the Executive Committee, frame bye-laws not inconsistent to these Rules and Regulations for the purpose of giving effect to and/or implementing the various provisions of these Rules and Regulations and for the proper and efficient administration of JFI and the Bodies of JFI ("**Bye-laws**").

40. FORCE OF THE BYE-LAWS, POLICIES, AND RULES/ PROCEDURES

- 40.1. The Byelaws, policies, and rules/ procedures made by JFI/Bodies of JFI shall have the same force as of the Rules and Regulations, provided that they are not contrary to these Rules and Regulations.
- 40.2. Policies and rules/ procedures of JFI/Bodies of JFI shall be ratified in the General Meeting next after the framing of such policies and rules/procedures.

41. NOTICES

- 41.1. Any notice required to be served on any Member or any other entity or person shall be served by post to their registered / official addresses.
- 41.2. All notices shall be served also by way of electronic mail to the official e-mail addresses as are furnished to JFI.
- 41.3. Any notice sent via post or e-mail shall be deemed to have been served at the time when the same was sent, and it shall be sufficient to prove either that the letter containing the notice was properly addressed and posted or that the email was sent to the correct e-mail address.
- 41.4. The notices for meetings of the General Body, Athletes Body, Executive Committee and Athletes Commission shall also be published online.
- 41.5. Inadvertent omission to give notice of meetings of any Body of JFI to any member entitled thereto or the nonreceipt thereof by such member shall not invalidate the proceedings of such meetings.

42. COMPLIANCE WITH LAW AND CONSTITUTIONS OF OTHER BODIES

- 42.1. JFI shall be bound by the [National Sports Act](#), Statute, regulations and decisions of International Judo Federation, Olympic Charter, the National Sports Code, government directives and applicable law, which shall prevail in case of any conflict with the Rules and Regulations, Bye-laws, policies and procedures.

43. INDEMNITY

- 43.1. Every person acting on behalf of JFI shall be indemnified out of JFI's funds against all losses and expenses incurred in the discharge of his or her duties, except those which have occurred through wilful act or default and if so, each one shall be chargeable only for so much moneys or properties as they shall actually receive for or in the discharge of the business of JFI and shall be answerable only for their own act, neglect or default and not for those of any other person.

44. LEGAL PROCEEDINGS

- 44.1. JFI shall sue or be sued in the name of the ~~General Secretary~~[Secretary General](#). A legal action/claim can only be filed at a court of law in New Delhi, where the Headquarters of JFI is based.

45. DISSOLUTION OF ~~THE TRUST~~ JFI

- 45.1. Subject to applicable law, JFI can be dissolved only:
- a) at a General Meeting, including an Adjourned Meeting; where
 - b) there is presence of Members having at least ~~3/4~~ 3/4th (three-fourth) of the total votes in a General Meeting, with the Full Members constituting the voting majority; and when
 - c) the resolution for amendment is passed by 2/3rd (two-thirds) majority of the total votes of the Members present at such General Meeting.
- 45.2. Subject to applicable law, in the event of dissolution of JFI, the assets and properties of JFI remaining on the date of dissolution after discharging all liabilities shall be transferred to another trust, society, association, organisation or institution whose objects are similar to those of JFI.

46. CERTIFICATION

- 46.1. It is certified that this is a correct copy of the Rules and Regulations of JFI.
