MINUTES OF THE MEETING HELD ON 8TH JUNE 2018 IN THE CHAMBER OF SECRETARY (SPORTS) TO CONSIDER THE ACTC PROPOSAL OF JUDO FEDERATION OF INDIA (JFI) FOR THE YEAR -2018-19.

- 1. Secretary (Sports) chaired the meeting. Addl. DG, RD (T), Director (Sports) MYAS & PO in charge and others attended. Judo Federation of India (JFI) was represented by the following:-
 - Shri Manmohan Jaiswal General Secretary
 - Shri Kailasham Yadav Treasurer
 - Shri Manohar Bangara Chairman, Technical Council
 - Shri C.S. Rajan Asstt. Secretary
- At the outset, it was informed that Govt. recognized the JFI from 2nd May 2018.
 Thereafter, Federation introduced the ACTC proposal as under: —
- The JFI is located in Delhi.
- As part of preparations for Asian Games, the camp for senior is being held at SAI centre Rohtak from 25th May to 11th June 2018.
- Selection trials for Asian Games is being held on 10th June 2018 at SAI centre Rohtak.
- In additional to individual events, for the first time, team event has also been introduced in the Asian Games with 3 Men & 3 Women forming a team.
- Services of support staff at Rohtak centre are being utilised for the camp.
- After the camp at Rohtak centre where selection trials are also taken place, there is no need for another camp before Asian Games for the following reasons:
- a. The players not selected for Asian Games may not attend the camp. The players selected for Asian Games are practising at their centres where all facilities are available. Hence, they would also not attend the camps.
- Three foreign exposures are proposed for selected senior players.
- For camps to be held after Asian Games, the facilities being provided by Gujarat Medical College at no cost to Govt. would be considered. In addition, for camps for Seniors after Asian Games, facilities at Devagadh Baria, Gujarat (owned by Sports Authority of Gujarat) may also be considered.
- The facilities available at Nadiad, Gujarat (facilities created by Sports Authority of Gujarat) would also be considered for holding camps for cadets & juniors.
- There are four Judokas under TOPS (2 Men & 2 Women).
- For the last two years, there has been no activity from Federation and due to this players' performance has come down heavily.

Secretary (Sports) in his initial remarks observed that the ACTC proposal of the Federation would be considered for the present up to Asian Games only. However, it was informed that Commonwealth Championship, a major International event would be held in Jaipur on 5th November 2018; further in this International competition, cadets/juniors in India would participate in large number and also win medals for India. Prior to Common wealth Championship, it is necessary to provide foreign exposure for cadets/juniors to provide better performance at Jaipur. Keeping these factors in view the meeting decided that ACTC proposal of the Federation for juniors up to November 2018 would be considered. In this backdrop, the ACTC proposal of JFI was taken up for consideration. Discussion took place component wise. Decisions taken on various components of the ACTC proposal are as follows:-

I. National Coaching Camps for seniors (Men & Women)

- Federation proposed six (6) coaching camps, as per details at Annexure-A.
 Three camps would be held before Asian Games and three camps after Asian Games.
- b. The meeting was informed that out of three (3) camps, camp for 18 athletes, 02 coaches and 01 supporting staff from 11th April to 18th April 2018 at NS NIS Patiala was not held.
- c. The camp proposed for 56 athletes, 04 coaches and 01 support staff from 25th May to 11th June 2018 was approved on file by the Competent Authority at a total estimated cost of Rs. 36,14,640/-. This camp was held in connection with preparation for the upcoming Asian Games.
- Federation also proposed a camp for 28 athletes, 04 coaches and 02 support staff from 18th June to 3rd July 2018 (16 days). However this camp will not take place, as there would not be sufficient numbers of campers, after selection trials on 10th June 2018.

II. International Competition / Exposure for Senior (Men & Women)

- Federation proposed 12 foreign exposures for the entire year 2018-19 (Details are given at Annexure-B). However as decided already, exposures up to Asian Games done were to be considered.
- Participation for 14 athletes, 04 coaches and 01 supporting staff in the Olympic qualifying tournament of South Asia Judo Championship 2018 in Nepal from 9th April to 24th April 2018 (5 days) was already approved on file by the Competent Authority. Total estimated expenditure was of the order of Rs. 14,20,250/-.
- The Foreign exposure for another Olympic qualifying tournament from 24th May to 28th May 2018 was not availed due to administrative reasons.
- Federation also proposed participation in 3 International tournaments of (i) Asian Open,
 Taipei (ii) Grand Prix, Croatia (iii) Grand prix, Hungary. All the three tournaments are
 Olympic qualifying tournaments. Participation in these tournaments is likely to increase



the players' ranking also in each competition, 14 athletes, 02 Coaches & 01 Support staff would participate. First two competitions for 5 days each and the 3rd competition for 10 days. After the third competition is over, the team will return to India and stay up to 22nd August 2018, before departure for Asian Games. The total estimated expenditure for the three International tournaments is **Rs. 85.12 lakh**. However, this figure is likely to undergo change at the time of consider action of the Federation proposal , as per the scheme of assistance to NSFs..

III. International Competition to be held in India for seniors , juniors, cadet and pre-cadet in which India team would also participate.

- Federation proposed holding of Commonwealth Judo Championship 2018 for senior, Juniors, Cadet and Pre cadet at Jaipur in Rajasthan from 5th November 2018 to 10th November 2018 (6 days). Amount sought for this purpose is Rs. 30.00 lakh. Sixty Commonwealth Countries would participate.
- As per the scheme of assistance to NSFs, maximum one-sixth of the allocation under the approved ACTC budget will be ear-marked for assisting the Federations for holding of International tournament in India, which are either ranking or mandatory or qualifying tournaments. An assistance of Rs. 30.00 lakh per tournament will be available for this purpose.
- One-sixth of the approved budget for JFI under ACTC is around Rs. 65.90 lakh. Therefore
 the financial assistance is to be restricted to Rs. 30.00 lakh only, as only one International
 Tournament is to be held.

JFI is, therefore, entitled for Rs. 30 lakh only for holding International Tournament in India. The Federation may, therefore, be advised to conduct the proposed international tournament in India, within the ceiling limit of Rs. 30 lakh.

Further, JFI should extend the same facilities provided to the foreign players, participating in international tournaments in India, To Indian players also, Expenditure on Indian players would also be met within the ceiling limit of Rs. 30 lakh. However, any expenses for lodging / boarding/travel/conveyance, not provided to any player by the organizer may be met out under ACTC after prior approval.

IV. National Championship:

• The National Championship for senior to be held in March 2019 at Vishakhapatnam, Andhra Pradesh as proposed by the Federation was approved. As per the scheme of assistance to NSFs, **Rs. 5.00 lakh** would be provided to the Federation, or the National Championship is for seniors only.


• The meeting advised the Federation to conduct the National Championship immediately after Asian Games for the purpose of talent scouting.

V. National Coaching Camp for Junior / Sub-Junior / Cadet (Boys & Girls):

- Federation proposed National Coaching Camps, details of which are given at ANNEXURE C, Federation's proposal for holding a camp at Nadiad, Gujarat from 09th April to 8th May 2018 (30 days) was approved on file by the Competent Authority. Expenditure approved for the camp was Rs. 52,43,200/- for 64 athletes and 08 coaches who were to attend. This camp was held in preparation of players for the 12th Asian Cadet & 19th Asian Junior judo championship. Subsequently Federation reduced camp period from 20.4.2018 to 8.5.2018 (18days). Accordingly the amount of approved expenditure was reduced to Rs. 13,44,160/-with the approval of Competent Authority.
- Another camp proposed is from 12th June to 10th July 2018 (29 days). The camp would be held at Nadiad, Gujarat where medical facilities and support staff like Physio are available. This camp is in connection with preparation for Judo Union of Asian (JUA) cadet and Jr. Asian Cup in Hongkong and Macau. 32 athletes and 04 coaches would attend the camp. Amount proposed was Rs.25.30 lakh.
- The meeting considered the necessity for the camp and approved the same at a total estimated expenditure of Rs.25.30 lakh.
- The 3rd proposal for organizing the camp from 3rd October to 3rd November 2018 (32 days) was at Nadiad, Gujarat, where all the facilities required for a camp are available. This camp is required for preparation of players for the Commonwealth Judo Championship to be held in Jaipur in November 2018. Federation proposed participation of 32 athletes and 04 coaches in the camp. Estimated expenditure for the camp is Rs. 26.91 lakh.
- PO in-charge informed that India could play 64 athletes and 08 coaches estimated of 32 days in the Commonwealth Judo Championship. The camp could be reduced to 21 days from 3rd October 2018. The reduction in the number of days was due to the reason that school going children (11th & 12th class) may not be ready to participate in a lengthy camp, as they have to attend to their studies also. Participation in this camp in so many number is likely to bring more medals for India. Therefore, the meeting advised the Federation to hold the camp for 64 athletes and 08 coaches in lieu of 32 athletes and 4 coaches, as proposed by the Federation. Estimated expenditure for camp is Rs. 28.76 lakh.

VI. International Competition for Juniors and Cadets (Boys & Girls):

Federation proposed Pre-International Competitions, details of which are given at ANNEXURE – D. The 1st International competition had already been held in May 2018 (6 days) in Lebanon. The Tournament's name was 12th Asian Cadet & 19th Asian Jr. Judo



- Championship. 32 athletes and 08 coaches participated in the competition. Estimated expenditure was **Rs.56.44 lakh**.
- PO in-charge informed that Federation's proposal in this regard was already approved on file by the Competent Authority. Total amount approved for the tournament was Rs. 56.44 lakh. Further in this competition Jr. and Cadets won 9 medals.
- Therefore the meeting satisafied participation of athletes in the said International competition and also the expenditure of Rs. 56.44 Lakh approved by the Competent Authority on the file.
- Federation's proposal for deputing 32 athletes and 04 coaches for participation in Asian Cadet & Asian Jr. Judo tournament's at Hongkong and Macau from 12th July to 23rd July 2018 (11 days) at total expenditure of Rs. 76.99 lakh was considered and approved, in the meeting, as participation in this type of tournament would help the players to win medals in the Commonwealth Judo Championship to be held at Jaipur in November 2018.
- The next proposal of the Federation was for participation in the Commonwealth Judo Championships to be held at Jaipur. This was already considered, while discussing the proposals for seniors. Therefore, federation should not have included this proposal here. Therefore, this proposal was not considered.

NOTE: The estimated expenditure for the two International competitions, approved in the meeting, would be restricted to the norms provided under the scheme of assistance to NSFs.

VII. National Championship:

- Federation proposed 02 National Championships, One for Sub-junior in August 2018 and the other is for Jr. in December 2018. Federation proposed expenditure for these 02 National Championships, as per the scheme of assistance to NSFs.
- However the meeting advised the Federation to conduct the National Championship for Juniors before November 2018, when India would host and participate in the Commonwealth Judo Championship to be held at Jaipur. This suggestion was made, keeping in view the practice, the Juniors would get in the National Championships, which would benefit them in their performance in the Commonwealth Judo Championship. Federation agreed to this suggestion.
- As per the scheme of assistance to NSFs, financial support admissible for conduct of National Championship for Junior and sub junior is Rs.17.00 lakh only. Accordingly, the meeting approved grant of Rs.17.00 lakh only to the Federation in this regard.

VIII. Miscellaneous:

- Federation requested that a Foreign Coach should be engaged as there are no proper Indian coaches. The meeting advised the Federation to follow the prescribed procedure for engagement of a Foreign Coach and submit their recommendation for consideration of SAI/Ministry.
- On the request of the Federation, the meeting approved the proposal to provide Judo
 Dress for 64 players. Unit cost of Judo Dress is estimated to be Rs. 11,000/-.
 Accordingly, the meeting approved financial support of Rs. 7.04 Lakh for providing Judo
 Dress to 64 players.
- Federation requested for financial assistance regarding Age-Verification test of athletes, especially for cadets and juniors through ACTC. The meeting advised the Federation to conduct the tests at their own cost, as it is not part of ACTC.

Thus, the meeting approved a total budget of Rs. 3,95,43,650/- for Judo Federation of India under ACTC for the year 2018-19.Component-wise allocation is as shown under:-


